Board of Governors - Meeting Minutes

A meeting of the Board of Governors was held on 5/13/03 at the Milleridge Inn. Present at the meeting were: Steven Stein P.E., Andrew Braum P.E, Craig Marshall P.E., Claudio Darras P.E., Steven Friedman, Peter Gerazounis P.E., Ray Schmitt, John Nally, Roger Dieffenbach DRC, and Bob Daly RVC Student Activities. The meeting was called to order at 5:15 PM and the following was discussed:

Steve Stein opened the meeting and called for committee reports:

<u>History</u> – Steve Friedman reported that we are doing well with PAOE points. Steve is still searching for past president data and possible autobiography information. Anyone who can assist please contact him.

Membership – Steve Stein announced that due to personal and professional commitments, Jeff Donahue will be stepping down from the board. Jeff will continue to serve as membership chair until the June 30th term ends.

<u>Programs</u> - Andrew Braum reported no new information. All programs to include next months June meeting are set.

Research Promotion – John Nally reported that Society had made some computer errors with the contribution report that resulted in a lower donation amount. The cur-

rent corrected collection total was approximately \$ 5,400.00, and he just collected an additional \$1,000.00. ASHRAE PROVIDES GUIDANCE ON DAMPER SELECTION

Control damper selection and sizing are a critical first step in the design of control systems. But many designers select economizer outdoor air, return air, and relief/exhaust air damper sizes and damper action based on rules of thumb that are not valid or valid only for certain applications, according to Steven Taylor, P.E. "This improper selection and sizing may cause improper temperature, flow, and pressure control and other operational difficulties," Taylor, chair of a committee that developed a new ASHRAE guideline on damper selection, said.

ASHRAE Guideline 16-2003 "Selecting Outdoor, Return, and Relief Dampers for Air-Side Economizer Systems" provides techniques for properly selecting dampers for the most common economizer relief system applications (return fans, relief fans and non-powered relief) and minimum outdoor air control strategies. The guide addresses the application and sizing of outdoor, return and relief dampers used to control outdoor air intake for economizer cooling, minimum ventilation outdoor airflow for indoor air quality and building pressure. The cost of ASHRAE Guideline 16-2003, Selecting Outdoor, Return, and Relief Dampers for Air-Side Economizer Systems, is \$19 for ASHRAE members plus S&H.

IMPROVING CLASSROOM COMFORT WITH STANDARD 62

The "formula" for controlling humidity and indoor air quality in school facilities is simple: Combining the proper ratio of outdoor air ventilation + the correct levels of space humidity = a comfortable classroom environment that can contribute to learning.

With a U.S. government study showing 20% of schools suffer from poor indoor air quality (IAQ) and 36% considered to have "less than adequate" HVAC systems, adherence to such a formula is needed, according to John Fischer. "School facilities, managers and their staff need to understand the importance of IAQ, humidity control, and the operation and the energy savings potential of their HVAC systems so that routine maintenance and proper system design and operation are given the appropriate priority," he said. Fischer, a technology consultant with SEMCO Inc. of Columbia, Mo., and co-author Charlene Bayer Ph.D., a researcher with Georgia Tech Research Institute in Atlanta, examine the need for humidity control in schools in the May issue of ASHRAE Journal. The issue contains articles featuring technologies and practices to improve the learning environment.

While all of the participating schools were designed in accordance with ASHRAE Std. 62, none of them designed with conventional systems were operated to provide the outdoor air quantities required by the standard. The report concluded that "most IAQ problems in school facilities can be avoided by providing adequate outdoor air ventilation on a continuous basis (15 cfm/student), controlling the indoor relative humidity between 30 and 60 percent and providing effective particulate filtration of the outdoor air."

The hypothesis echoes recommendations in ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 62-2001 "Ventilation for Acceptable Indoor Air Quality". The standard recommends 15 cfm/person of outdoor air for school classrooms and that indoor "spaces preferably should be maintained between 30 and 60% RH" according to Fischer.

He also notes than most IAQ problems could be avoided with use of desiccant-based dedicated outdoor air systems (DOAS), which proved an effective way to operate facilities in accordance with Standard 62. Schools using DOAS could be ventilated at the 15 cfm/student rate while maintaining the space humidity as desired, he said. "The schools provided with increased ventilation and humidity control had improved comfort and perceived indoor air quality," he said. "Average absenteeism was determined to be 9% lower for these schools."



Membership at that time was approximately 20-25 members attending each monthly meeting. The topics of discussion at the meetings were HVAC applications relevant to industrial and processing plants. Engineering type designs which were in demand at that time included school work, Stonybrook Univ. College & Hospital, North Shore Hospital and various industrial parks. Coincidentally, an average engineers' salary at that time was about \$12,000.00 per year.

Currently, Henry is still active within the engineering community as he continues to attend and support the Long Island ASHRAE Chapter. He also is involved in the Long Island Chapters' 2004 hosting of the CRC in which he is participating in various committees.
