

## CTTC - Outdoor Air Ventilation Standard ASHRAE 62.1-2007

ASHRAE credits lessons learned in 30 years of ventilation, input from design engineers and recent developments in research for the latest changes made to ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 62.1-2007, *Ventilation for Acceptable Indoor Air Quality*. In the procedure for calculation ventilation rates for commercial and institutional building. ASHRAE's updated ventilation standard boasts a more accurate ventilation determination procedure, which often leads to reduced outdoor air quantities. ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 62.1-2007, *Ventilation for Acceptable Indoor Air Quality*, has outlined a procedure that shall be followed to determine the outdoor air rates for a system. The new standard explicitly recognizes buildings a source of indoor air pollutants and explicitly accounts for ventilation efficiency.

The calculation can be divided into six steps. Follow each step in order, all tables referenced herein are found in ASH-RAE Standard 62.1-2007.

#### STEP ONE – BREATHING ZONE OUTDOOR AIRFLOW

Zone Calculations:

The design outdoor airflow required in the breathing zone of the occupied space or spaces in a zone shall be referred to as *Breathing Zone Outdoor Airflow* (Vbz) and shall be calculated based the following formula:

Vbz = Rp \* Pz + Ra \* Az

Where:

 $Az = the net occupiable floor area of the zone (ft^2)$ 

Pz = the largest number of people expected to occupy the zone during typical usage. If Pz is unknown determine the default occupant density using Table 6-1.



## CTTC - Outdoor Air Ventilation Standard ASHRAE 62.1-2007 (Cont'd. from Page 8)

Rp = the outdoor airflow per person as determined from Table 6-1 Ra = outdoor airflow rate per unit as determined from Table 6-1

The breathing zone is defined as the region within an occupied space between planes 3 and 72 inches above the finished floor and more than 2 ft from walls or fixed air conditioning equipment.

**STEP TWO – ZONE OUTDOOR AIRFLOW** Based on the air distribution system the effectiveness of the outdoor air to mix into the room is affected. Step 2 adjusts the zone air requirements based on a *zone air distribution effectiveness* value. This value is referred to as Ez and is determined from Table 6-2

Once the Ez is calculated, the *breathing zone outdoor airflow* (Vbz) is adjusted and the *zone outdoor airflow* is calculated using the formula:

Voz = Vbz / Ez

**STEP THREE – DISCHARGE OUTDOOR AIR FRACTION** By using Table 6-3 to determine the system ventilation efficiency, the *zone primary outdoor airflow fraction* (Zp) shall be determined.

Zp = Voz / Vpz

Where:

Voz = zone outdoor airflow

Vpz = the primary airflow supplied to the zone from the air handling unit at which the outdoor air is located. It includes outdoor intake air and recirculated air from the air handling unit.

**STEP FOUR – SYSTEM VENTILATION EFFICIENCY** The zone primary outdoor air fraction (Vpz) is then used to look up the System ventilation efficiency (Ev) found on table 6-3. The zone primary outdoor air fraction shall be determined for each individual space. Only the largest zone primary outdoor air fraction Zp shall be considered when determining the System ventilation efficiency.

**STEP FIVE – UNCORRECTED OUTDOOR AIR INTAKE** The design *uncorrected outdoor air intake* (Vou) shall be determined in accordance with the equation below.

 $Vou = D * \Sigma(Rp * Pz) + \Sigma(Ra * Az)$ 

The occupant diversity (D) shall be used to account for variations in occupancy within the zones served by the system.

 $D = Ps / \Sigma Pz$ 

Ps = system population = the maximum number of occupants in the area served by the system.

**STEP SIX – OUTDOOR AIR INTAKE FLOW** The System ventilation efficiency calculated in Step 4 is now used to correct the *outdoor air intake*. This is the final step and shall yield the *outdoor air intake flow*. This is the outdoor air volume that shall be introduced into the system at the air handler. *Outdoor air intake flow* (Vot) is calculated as follows

Vot = Vou / Ev


