CTTC - CRC, CTTC and BTU's

Welcome back to another "season" of ASHRAE-LI. What better way to begin than with an alphabet soup of acronyms. Your chapter officers, Board of Governor members and Committee chairs have just returned from the 2015 Chapter Regional Conference (CRC), hosted this year by the Central New York Chapter, in Syracuse. Steve Sill, CRC Chair and Bill Walter, his Co-chair, and their CRC Committee really put on a great event. We often do not think about the amount of effort and planning that goes into putting on an event like this, however, as the LI Chapter is currently in the planning process for hosting this event in 2017, all who attended took good notes. Rich Halley is Chairing the LI Chapter CRC-2017 Committee and, lacking a thaumaturgic spell, will require the support and effort of all of our chapter's membership to ensure a successful event. For those who are not familiar with the CRC, this is the time when your chapter officers and committee chairs attend workshops and business meetings to learn and/or improve our organizational skills and knowledge, to ensure the smooth running of the local chapters.



While the Chapter delegates and alternates were attending meetings on the Thursday of CRC, several technical sessions took place highlighting the technical history of the Syracuse area, as well as current and future technology studies associated with the area. Dr. Edward Bogucz (Executive Director of the Syracuse Center of Excellence in Environmental and Energy Systems), presented an informative session on the history of Syracuse as a technical/Industrial center; the predecessors of ASHRAE (ASHVE and ASRE) and the building of the Erie Canal, which provided the impetus for much of the technological and industrial growth of the area (and the United States in general). The construction of the canal established Syracuse as an inland "port". Without the canal, more than likely ships would have bypassed New York City and traveled to the Gulf of Mexico to sail up the Mississippi River, rather than up the Hudson River and across the Erie Canal. When you look back on the development resulting from the canal, you realize that one project can have a wideranging effect.

Those in attendance then got to hear from Seth Mulligan and Dan Cowen about the work of the Centerstate Corporation for Economic Opportunity, specifically the "incubator" approach to assisting the development and commercialization of new ideas and technology. The technical session included presentations from several participants in the incubator; one, developing CO₂ and occupancy sensors incorporated into wiring devices (receptacles and switches) which wirelessly communicate the data to a control system to control the outside and conditioned air; while another is perfecting a concentrating technology for solar PV and solar hydronic to increase the conversion efficiency. The work of Dr. Ez Khalifa and the Advanced Manufacturing - Thermal and Environmental Controls initiative (AM-TEC), including the Green Data Center at Syracuse University, was discussed. After the technical and business sessions on Thursday were finished, everyone migrated to the Dinosaur Bar-B-Que for food, music and the good company of those present.

On CRC Friday, while the delegates and alternates attended their caucus, Director and Regional Chair (DRC) Bill Walter conducted the Chapter Operations Workshop. Topics covered in this workshop included the importance of leadership and delegation, effective chapter planning, use of the Manual of Chapter Operations, Sustainability activities, the new on -line Chapter Information Questionnaire (CIQ), importance of bEQ topics and events, as well as insight into the reasons and implementation of the President's Award of Excellence system of points (PAOE).

After lunch, there was a demonstration of the "Steamboat Challenge", a series of STEM educational events and programs, culminating in a Do It Yourself Steamboat race. These steamboats are a variation of the Putt Putt steam boat developed in the 1890s by an Englishman, and popular for years as toys...(possibly only losing some popularity as a bathtub toy for children when the thought of a toy with a live flame unnerved some people). The twist to the Steamboat Challenge is that the contestants build their own boat with "odds and ends", some of which can be sourced from the typical household waste stream. All in all, a great way to introduce youth to the concepts of steam generation and propulsion, as well as the concepts of repurposing and conserving resources.

After the Steamboat demonstration, those who weren't busy with meetings walked the two blocks or so to the Center of Excellence, where Dr. Bogucz gave a condensed version of the previous day's history presentation and highlighted the features of the Center of Excellence building, as well as the research taking place within. While providing detailed descriptions of all of the technology associated with the Center of Excellence would take a book, the key features we saw on the tour included:

- Brown-Field reclamation, and the attendant issues for such sites.
- Reduction in the structural material needed by judicious use of cantilevers
- Diversion of 98% of the construction waste from the landfill
- Provision for storm water retention
- Rainwater collection, treatment and reuse for flushing toilet fixtures
- Energy recovery ventilators
- Bio Fuel research
- Laser ignition (combustion engine) research
- Use of compact fluorescent and LED lighting fixtures
- Use of daylight harvesting to minimize energy needed for lighting
- Electronically controlled blinds in the south facing windows, to minimize insolation in summer.
- Radiant heating and cooling panels (ceiling mounted) throughout
- Combination of ceiling mounted radiant heating and cooling panels along with displacement ventilation from floor mounted grilles in the P. Ole Fanger Room.
- Regenerative elevators which return power to the building or grid when travelling downward
- High efficiency boiler
- Ground water source heat pumps
- Green roof plantings
- A building management system, which integrates the control of HVAC and other building systems to optimize operation. This includes indicators to show when it is beneficial to open the windows for natural ventilation to conserve energy.

Finally the Center of Excellence includes the Willis H. Carrier Total Indoor Environmental Quality (TIEQ) Laboratory, where studies are conducted on the relationship of temperature, humidity, air quality, lighting and sound on human health.

After having worked up an appetite walking up and down the Center of Excellence, the attendees boarded the bus for Hinderwadel's Grove, for the Presidential Dinner. For those who are fond of clams, this was bi-valve nirvana. For those that didn't like clams there was a vast selection of food, with something for everyone. Prior to dessert, Bjarne Olesen (ASHRAE Treasurer) presented the Presidential Address on behalf of President Underwood, expressing the theme of "Making Connections".

After breakfast on Saturday, the workshops for the various committee chairs took place. As Chapter Technology Transfer Committee Chair, I attended the CTTC workshop facilitated by Chris Phelan - RVC CTTC and Pete Oppelt - RVC Programs. Chuck Gulledge, now ASHRAE Vice-President, but with roots in CTTC, as well as Candace Pettigrew from Society participated in this workshop.
